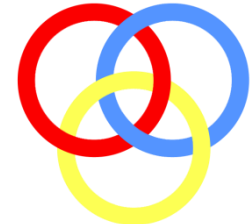

Low Furness Primary School recognises the importance it gives to all pupils' welfare and Safeguarding.

The purpose of this good practice leaflet is to share with you our excellent safeguarding practice and the responsibility we have to Safeguard all our pupils.

- We work to establish and maintain an ethos where children feel secure and will be listened to in an open positive atmosphere. This includes activities within the Curriculum: PHCSE, SEAL, SERIS, Kidsafe and other avenues in school; e.g. School Council.
- We ensure the children know that they can approach any member of staff if they are worried or in difficulty.
- We actively seek the views of children, listening to them and involving them in decisions about their education.
- We will make any referrals necessary to ensure the well being of all children is safeguarded.

***“No single professional can have a full picture of a child’s need and circumstances and, if children and families are to receive the right help at the right time, everyone who comes into contact with them has a role to play in identifying concerns, sharing information and taking prompt action.”(Working Together to Safeguard Children, HM Government 2015)***

## Roles and Responsibilities

Staff in school are in a good position to keep a watchful eye on children and their safety and to protect them from harm.

If staff have concerns they have a duty to inform **Mrs. Little, Designated Safeguarding Lead** or in her absence **Mrs. Tracey**.

**Mrs. Taplin** is responsible for delivering Kidsafe in school and is also our SERIS worker.

## The Role of the Governing Body

Safeguarding children is a ‘collective responsibility’ for the whole of the Governing Body. Every school should have a Nominated Governor for Safeguarding; Child Protection. At Low Furness this responsibility is shared between **Mrs. Stubbs** and **Mr. Lunn**.

If we feel a child is in need or in danger we are committed to sharing the relevant information in line with Working Together to Safeguard Children, HM Government 2015.

Our full and comprehensive policy for Safeguarding; Child Protection can be requested from the Head teacher.
