Also a pack of 6 relay batons, rubber quoits and 2 packs of floor spots.	£87.30	After an audit of the PE equipment it was discovered that additional resources were required. The purchase of this PE equipment has ensured our 'summer sport' can be developed using quality resources.
June 2017	Yorkshire Purchasing Purchase of 12 Size 4 rugby balls solely for the use of Key Stage Tag-Rugby Club	£101.95	The Key Stage after-school Tag Rugby Club which has up to 20 children from Year 3 - 6 attending each week lacked quality resources. The balls were purchased and are stored in a bag in a safe environment so no longer become played with and lost at playtimes. This has resulted in the equipment being readily available, the children having the weekly opportunity to practice their skills and the quality of play improving

An outdoor container was sourced and purchased; this has been sited on the Key Stage 2 playground. Equipment is now easily assessable and it is now being used more effectively and more regularly.

During this same time frame the Year 3 and 4 children received 6 x 1 hour sessions of Basketball coaching and the Year 5 and 6 children received Tag-Rugby coaching.</p>	£840	<p>The Multi-skills sessions proved to be very popular and enjoyable with the children. As well as providing CPD for staff it also gave them the opportunity to assess the children as they enter their new year groups. There is no teaching of Basketball expertise within the school staff, the coaching sessions plugged a gap and enabled 39 children in Year 3/4 to develop new skills. Likewise with Tag-Rugby in Year 5/6.</p>

It is essential that children living on the Furness Peninsula can stay safe in the water, Low Furness prides itself on developing this strength within our children Through this provision we are able to report that for the academic year 2017-2018 100% of pupils within our Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.</p>

The children enjoyed bettering their scores and we found that the 'less active' children thrived on the personal challenges involved
March 2018	Specialised staffing for the coaching of Gymnastics	£428.70	Mrs Siona Hartley worked with the more able gymnasts from Years 1 to 6 with the specific aim to prepare them for the Key Steps competition. Alongside this she provided quality CPD for staff as they were able to observe and try out safe, quality techniques for the development of gymnastic ability. 22 children competed for the school and performed well, it also gave us the opportunity to allow Sports Leaders to support and develop the teams.
