A good range of skills acquired and used. The children performed well and on some occasions podium positions were achieved. More so the children were proud to represent the school, wear the t-shirt and tracksuit and be rewarded in Praise Assembly. This has developed self-esteem and greater confidence in the sporting arena.</p>

In addition, the coach ran a Multi Skills after-school club</p>	<b>£5520</b>	<p>All sessions proved to be very popular and enjoyable with the children. As well as providing CPD for staff it also gave them the opportunity to assess the children in their year groups. The Multi-skills After-School Club, which was supported by 27 children from Reception and Key Stage 1, developed skills and team working in a more relaxed environment.</p>

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June 2021	<b>Cumbria Wheelchair Sports Club</b> A whole day visit from Nat Pattinson (a member of the GB wheelchair basketball team)	<b>£225</b>	Nat is an inspirational young man who delivered a whole school assembly then throughout the day each child had the opportunity to play wheelchair basketball. Not only was this a very enjoyable experience but it also gave the children the opportunity to learn to empathise and understand dealing with a disability.
