September 2023 - August 2024	<b>Onside Sports Coaching</b> A qualified coach provided 1 hour sports sessions for every child in Nursery and Reception throughout the year. In addition, the coach ran a Multi Skills after-school club	<b>£4810</b>	All sessions proved to be very popular and enjoyable with the children. As well as providing CPD for staff it also gave them the opportunity to assess the children in their year groups. The Multi-skills After-School Club, which was supported by 27 children from Reception and Key Stage 1, developed skills and team working in a more relaxed environment.
