Golf is an area of physical education which is not strength of many of the staff; the coaching sessions have resulted in colleagues having increased confidence in the teaching of this discipline. Each Key Stage 2 class entered a team into a timed inter school event. The coaching has had the impact of enabling the Year 4 and the Year 5/6 teams to qualify for the finals which were held in Barrow –in – Furness.</p>
